

This Maundy Thursday, March 29<sup>th</sup>, Covenant will be celebrating the Lord's Supper and a reading of the passion narrative as we have done for quite a few years now. This Communion/Tenebrae service will begin at 7 pm. Just prior to that service however we will be trying something new – which is actually quite old. Beginning at 6 pm, the sanctuary will be open for all who wish to come and participate in a footwashing service, modelled after the story found in John 13 of Jesus washing his disciples' feet. While this ritual has never become a sacrament of the church, it has long been used to illustrate Jesus' call to love one another in a spirit of compassion and servant-hood and radical love. In fact, the name Maundy Thursday is derived from *mandatum novum*, or "new commandment," the Latin translation of Jesus' teaching in John: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another" (John 13:34). We hope you will join us for both of these services. To be clear, you do not have to participate in the 6 pm footwashing service to attend the 7 pm communion service. But try not to be deterred from coming at 6 by the prospect of other people seeing your feet; after all, God created them, not for beauty, but so we could follow in the hard yet joyful way of Jesus. So in the words of Dr. Seuss, "Feet, feet! See how many feet you meet!"
