

THANK A TREE FOR GOOD HEALTH! Trees are a valuable community asset for many reasons, but public health may be among the least known. As early as 1881, landscape architect Frederick Law Olmstead said that the influences of nature "touch us so quietly that we are hardly conscious of them." The health benefits from trees and other greenery are examples of these quiet providers, and their benefits can be broken into these into four categories.

PHYSICAL: Trees filter the air, sequester carbon, and provide oxygen. Their shade also reduces gasoline evaporation and even prolongs the life of asphalt surfaces.

HUMAN ACTIVITY: Studies have found that community trees encourage healthful outdoor activities that fight obesity, reduce cholesterol, and even increase brain functions.

SOCIAL SUPPORT: By encouraging people to be outside, trees have been found to provide benefits such as reducing crime and promoting creativity in children.
