



Parents Corner: For the three weeks leading up to Easter, we go to the "Garden of Gethsemane." Work on spelling Gethsemane with your child! Try to locate it on a map of the city of Jerusalem. Jesus was there the night before his arrest. His last act before his trial is to take his closest companions with him to a place of prayer. Interestingly, Luke does not include the name of the garden as other gospels do; the evangelist just refers to it "the place." Places become sacred as they facilitate a desire to draw close to God. As you see in the memory verse above, the heart of Jesus' prayer is one of intention: "remove this cup;" as well as submission: "not my will, but Thine" (nothing quite does it like the King James translations in instances like these). So much is happening in these few passages which speak to our faith journey including: the importance of companionship, of naming our intentions, of surrendering to that which is out of our control, and trusting God is present in the midst of all of it. These concepts are probably better understood, initially, when our children are in their mid-teens, which is just the beginning of their understanding. Sometimes they are not understood at all by people of faith who, instead would prefer to gloss over the suffering narrative and get straight to the "good stuff" of Easter. But, "the place" is at the crux of the spiritual journey. Exposing our younger children to this portion of the faith narrative may make it not only more easy to comprehend at a later stage of life, but also a very valuable lesson to cling to when suffering comes, which it inevitably will. This may seem like a *qloomy* lesson to engage with our children for the weeks leading up to Easter, but doesn't the contrast make the Easter celebration that much sweeter?


