





Parents Corner: Holy Week is close at hand. Our Lenten journey in WoRM has taken us to the desert where Jesus fasted. From the desert we skipped past all of Jesus public ministry to the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed before his trial, death and resurrection (yes, the children were a bit confused as the Christian calendar can do). This Sunday before Holy Week begins gives us an opportunity to explore an aspect of that week with the children. Have you ever wondered what kind of meal Christ shared with his disciples at the Last Supper? The Seder tradition is the joyful family dinner and worship service which is held in Jewish homes on Passover every year, which this year is April 19th, the same day as Good Friday. Seder means order. The Seder consists of a number of ceremonies of extreme antiquity. Through these ceremonies and symbols, we can feel the trials of the ancient Jews as they went through the Exodus - the release of their embittered life of bondage in Egypt and the joy of their subsequent freedom as they crossed the Red Sea, leaving the land of Pharaoh. This Sunday, April 7, the children will share in a simplified version of the Seder meal, which may include: THE KIDDUSH (FIRST CUP), THE URCHATZ (THE RITUAL CLEANSING), THE MAGGID (the children's guestions), THE YAHATZ (breaking the unleavened bread of the matzah), THE HALLEL (PSALM 113), and the DAYYENU (closing ceremony). Through food and ritual we form deep memory and exuberant hope in the God of all peoples.
