Besides luncheon, The Graduates have made trips to sight see and eat on "road trips" to Atlanta, Braselton, Lake Oconee, and area new restaurants and old favorites. They have arranged seminars on such topics as End of Life issues and Estate Planning.


Opportunity to Practice Hospitality- Family Promise of Athens
