

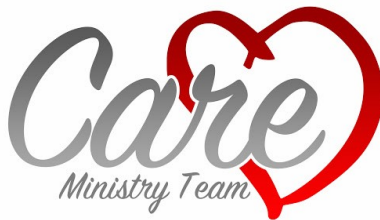

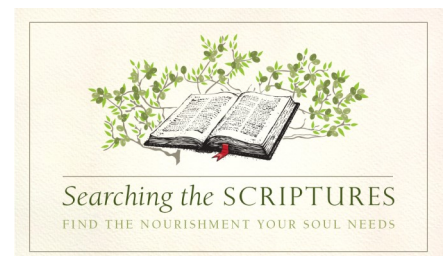

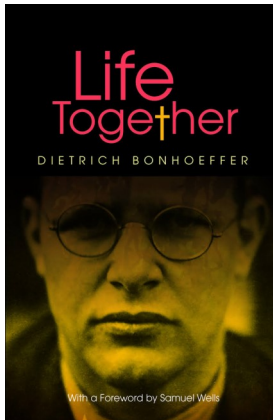

Engaging with Bonhoeffer: A Zoom Book Study of Life Together



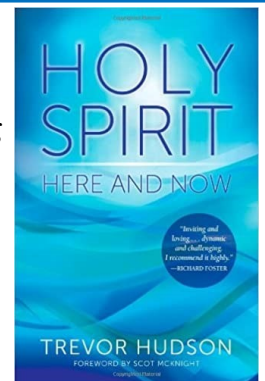
Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a Lutheran pastor and theologian whose radical commitment to the gospel of Jesus placed him squarely in conflict with the Nazi regime of Adolf Hitler. Before his execution by the Nazis in 1945, Bonhoeffer helped to organize a small underground seminary that sought to offer a vision of the Christian life that was a clear alternative to the hyper-nationalism blessed and practiced by the majority of German Christians. First published in 1939, *Life Together* is a slender but potent volume that captures the fruit of that experiment in Christian living at a time when the church was under tremendous pressure to compromise its faith for the sake of survival in a fascist climate. Perhaps it is an appropriate time for us to listen again to Bonhoeffer's witness and wisdom.

I hope you will consider joining me for this **five week** book study via Zoom on **Wednesday evenings at 7 pm**, starting **May 27th** and concluding on **June 24th**. We will keep our discussions to a one hour time limit. I will send out a pdf file of the readings as close to one week in advance as possible. Alternatively, you can order your own copy of the book at relatively low cost. While I know Amazon is cheaper and faster, please consider supporting our local, independent bookstores! If you would like to be a part of this discussion, please send me your email address asap so I can include you in the Zoom invitation. I look forward to reflecting with you on our life together in Christ.

Covenant's Emergency Food Pantry

Members, and friends of Covenant have been giving generously of their time and talents to the Emergency Food Pantry. As you can imagine, the need is great. For the month of March 331 families were served by the wonderful volunteers of Covenant's Emergency Food Pantry.

we will be following the process one of our volunteers dubbed the "Chick Fi La" approach:

Food will be bagged ahead of time and placed on tables in the fellowship hall. More square footage there allows for ease of social distancing.

Meat and cheese will be added at the time of distribution. (if available)

Neighbors in need of food will be instructed by our "parking lot attendant" to drive up to the side door of the fellowship hall.

Food bags will then be handed off to the neighbor.

We have masks, gloves and sanitizer for volunteers

Currently, Covenant's Food Pantry is still available on Tuesdays, Thursdays 1pm – 4pm.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

STAY SAFE—If there is any reason at all that you should NOT physically volunteer-consider the following:

Make a financial donation to the Food Pantry by sending a check to Covenant and write "food pantry" in the subject line. (You could send it in at the same time you send in your pledge).

We can use grocery bags (paper or plastic), and small boxes to pack the food. If you call the church, someone could even come out to your car and get it.
