Everything else would be OK unwashed. A special note about CHEESE BAGS: Simple Truth cheese bags should be placed in the Simple Truth drawer; other brands should be placed in the cheese bags drawer. It makes a difference because TerraCycle pays us for the Simple Truth packaging, but not for other brands. I'm excited about this new recycling opportunity! 
Participants will become equipped to explain about as well as answer questions for members and friends of Covenant relating to the:
