March 14th / Genesis, Chapter 19


March 21st / Psalm 89

We will meet on Monday, March 22 & 29 at 7pm, we will work through Angela Davis' "Are Prisons Obsolete" and explore the history of the American prison system through the work of one of one of our country's most impactful justice activists, Angela Yvonne Davis.

More about Angela Davis: Born in Birmingham, Alabama in 1944, Davis studied at Brandeis University, the Sorbonne, and with Herbert Marcuse at the Goethe Institute. In 1998, Davis was one of the twenty-five organizers of the historic Berkeley, California conference "Critical Resistance: Beyond the Prison Industrial Complex." She is the author of many books, including Are Prisons Obsolete? and The



Meaning of Freedom. She currently teaches in the History of Consciousness Department at the University of California, Santa Cruz. *Email twilliams@covpresathens.org for more info.*






