The Re-Opening Task Force met on Wed., May 26 to begin the steps necessary to return to in-person worship at Covenant. With the case positivity rate very low (a 7-day average of new cases per day was 5, as of May 25) in Clarke County, we believe we can re-gather with precautions in place that will reflect the CDC guidelines for indoor gatherings and respect the range of comfort levels that exist while emerging from a global pandemic.

As a first step to gathering, we will hold a brief service on Sunday, June 6 at 9 AM, to honor our high school graduates. That service will be held in the outdoor worship area. All are invited. You will find the guidelines for this first re-gathering in this newsletter.

As we return to in-person worship, the pre-recorded service will cease for obvious reasons. In order to serve the entire congregation, the lessons of the last 16 months clearly indicate that we need to live-stream our service. Particularly the families with young children, who are still awaiting a vaccine, may view their only option to be via live-stream.

Live streaming is new technology for Covenant. The necessary equipment has been ordered and the measures to install cameras and other provisions are in the works. We appreciate all that Asher Hill has taken on to make this happen in a timely way.

A few months ago the Session approved renovations to the Worship Center. This includes new paint, carpet, and a few more minor updates to aging fixtures, etc. In order to install the carpet, the pews will be temporarily removed. The original hope was to complete this work before re-gathering for in-person worship.

Since the guidelines for a safe return to worship have changed dramatically over the last two weeks, all of the efforts to speed up the necessary work to live-stream and refurbish the Worship Center are front and center. Must we complete that work before we re-gather? No, but there is a strong desire to at least be able to live-stream the service. If we return to in-person worship before the work is completed, we might need to briefly pause for one or two weeks while the major displacement occurs. If that happens, we can briefly return to a pre-recorded format.

Just tell us when we are going to return to in-person worship, right? We are trying for a mid-summer return.

Some have asked about worshiping outside until the renovations allow us to be inside. The heat is the main factor for steering away from that option. The unpredictable weather, limited seating, and lack of suitable amplification equipment add to the dilemma.

We will commit to weekly updates so that you know what we know. In the meantime, please hang in with us. *Julie Bower*, for the Re-Opening Task Force

Frequently Asked Questions About "Going Solar" at Cov Presby

Responses furnished by Turnsol Energy, the selected contractor . . .

Explain how rooftop installation does not create problems with storm water seepage into the ceilings and rooms below the solar panel mounting racks?

Butyl tape is installed under feet and minimal penetrations are used. Panels and rails are 4" off the roof to allow drainage.

The proposed solar panel system is planned for installation on sections of the roof above the Fellowship Hall, above the hallway alongside church offices, and possibly above the Gathering Room.

Where are the solar panels and inverters manufactured?

Inverters are manufactured in Israel. The panels are up to you. The panels I spec'ed are Chinese, but we can go with USA panels if desired, for no extra charge.

How would you explain the procedures for long term care and maintenance of the solar panels? One of the best things about solar is the low maintenance required. It is monitored, so if there are issues it shows up in monitoring. If pollen is high, they need to be washed off once a year.

What other solar panel installation jobs have you completed for churches, or other non-profits; and what is their experience with the operation and maintenance of these systems? Turnsol Energy has done multiple jobs for UGA. [When contacted, a UGA program supervisor indicated satisfaction with a variety of different solar panel installation projects performed by Turnsol Energy.]

Beyond solar panel installation, does your company assure that all preconstruction requirements are duly permitted; and does your company align the system (including net-metering arrangements) with Georgia Power as the back-up supplier? I also own an electrical company (Drew Bowen Electric). We will pull a permit and help file the interconnection agreement. The interconnection agreement needs to have details about your Georgia Power account and an authorized signature on behalf of the church.

Does the solar panel generated power shut down, on those occasions that power goes off from the primary back-up supplier? Yes, this is a safety feature, in accordance with UL licensing 1798.

What measures are needed to expand the solar panel system in future, were that deemed to be desirable? Solar is easily expanded at any time with minimal additional effort.

What is your view of the advantages and disadvantages of including storage battery capacity with the system? I would love to sell you batteries, but they aren't really cost effective.

What is your understanding of the "appropriate quantity of inverters"? I have seen proposals with one per panel, or one per designated sector of installed panels. Both options are viable, and we can do either for the same cost. The micro-inverter (one per panel) is a good option for smaller systems and allows a clean look. The "string inverter" is also a good option, but it does require an inverter on the wall somewhere by the meter. It's really kind of an installer preference. Micro-inverters are harder to acquire at this moment, but that could change in a week.

What does your proposal mean by the terminology "initial up-front installation cost"? Are there subsequent up-front installation expenses? This is just the form language on the proposal that makes more sense when tax credits go along with it. There are not additional expected costs outside of cleaning the panels periodically.

What do you expect to be the duration of time needed for completing this project? Three weeks to a month at most. It could go quicker, but I like to give a longer time and make the client happy, as opposed to giving you best case scenario and then not living up to expectations.


NEW BOOK STUDY—Tuesday, June 1 at 10am—Join us as we delve into the "The Book of Joy: Lasting
