She chaired at least one study team to develop a strategic plan for Covenant church, co-chaired the Transition With Continuity Task Force, and also served with various Presbytery special activities and committees, ultimately being chosen for a term of leadership as Moderator of Northeast Georgia Presbytery.

This 2:00 p.m. worship event celebrating the life of Anne Page will commence with service music at 1:30 p.m., including by live-stream. The Reverend Martha Starnes has been selected to officiate, with contributions anticipated from Anne’s immediate and extended family. COVID protocols for indoor gatherings will be observed. Equipping Peacemakers in Congregations and Around the World.

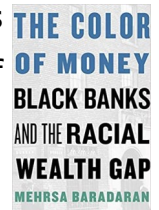
