

Interim Pastor Coming to Covenant

Covenant Presbyterian Church will welcome Reverend Dana Waters as our interim pastor, beginning December 1. Session approved the Personnel Committee's nomination of Reverend Dana at its October 26 meeting. Currently pastor of McDonough Presbyterian Church in McDonough GA, Reverend Dana and his wife Kira will move to Athens, where they are currently looking for a home in our community. In the Presbyterian Church, interim pastors have two significant missions. First, they serve all of a pastor's normal functions: preaching, moderating Session, leading staff, serving at weddings and funerals, and helping us when we need it. Second, interims help the congregation begin the search for a new "called and installed" pastor, doing a self-examination to determine who we are and our goals and missions. For all of that, the denomination requires special training and experience.

Reverend Dana Waters has substantial preparation for Covenant's interim position. He has a Masters of Divinity from Columbia Seminary and additional training in mediation, heads of staff functions, youth ministry, and interim pastor functions. He has served as associate pastor for youth and mission ministries in Clemson, and director of youth ministry in Atlanta and Aiken.
