

Library Corner: Take This Bread

During the first year of the pandemic, my son and I volunteered with Covenant's food pantry and found it a rewarding experience. Someone recommended Sara Miles' book Take This Bread: The Spiritual Memoir of a Twenty-First -Century Christian. Miles was raised as an atheist and described herself as "a lesbian left-wing journalist." Thus, she was unprepared for the



pull she felt when she walked into an urban church in San Francisco. Within months she was running their ever-growing food pantry for those in need. The process was messy and anything but straightforward, yet the pantry became a place where God's welcome and grace made sense of Christ's call to "feed my sheep." 

TerraCycle + Kroger Packaging = \$\$

A few weeks ago, I mailed our first box of Kroger packaging to TerraCycle and it earned \$13.65. This is important because TerraCycle does not pay the shipping costs for packaging such as candy bags and wrappers, so the \$13.65 will go toward that.

If you shop at Kroger, saving plastic bags and wrappers for TerraCycle is easy because there are so many items that qualify. A few examples: bread bags, frozen vegetable and fruit bags, chip and salty snack bags, bags from cookies, nuts, coffee and fresh produce such as carrots, apples, potatoes, etc. Also, wrappers from packages of paper products and bottled water.

Remember, only Kroger brands count. This includes Simple Truth, Private Selection, Luvsome pet products, as well as the ordinary Kroger brand. *Caren Snook for the Green Dream Team*



OPPORTUNITIES TO GIVE DURING ADVENT/CHRISTMAS

Meals on Wheels - to be received in the month of December and at the Christmas Eve service sponsor persons who receive a daily meal through the "Meals on Wheels" program. The annual cost (including food & expenses) to provide meals for one person is \$2,000.00. Last year's offering enabled Covenant to support 7.5 older Athenians for this year. The congregation is encouraged to give generously. Consider making a special gift in honor or in memory of a loved one.

COVENANT'S SPECIAL FUNDS

Benevolence Fund - to assist members and friends of the church in a crisis.

Bowden Church Vocation Fund – to provide financial assistance toward the education of members who feel called to full-time employment in ministry and to provide support to those who are mission volunteers through PCUSA or specific ministries of outreach supported by Covenant.

Memorial Fund - set up to receive gifts in memory of loved ones to be used for or through Covenant Church in consultation with the family of the deceased.

SPECIAL SEASONAL OFFERINGS

January - *Joy Gift* - to assist retired ministers by supplementing Medicare premiums and to assist minority Presbyterian colleges.

February - *Bowden Church Vocation Fund* - to provide financial assistance toward the education of members who feel called to full-time employment in ministry and to provide support to those who are mission volunteers through PCUSA or specific ministries of outreach supported by Covenant.

Easter - One Great Hour of Sharing - to combat hunger, disease, and poverty world-wide.

May - Presbyterian Homes - to support our homes for older adults in Georgia.

October - *Peacemaking* - to support ministries of peace throughout the world and within the local community.

November - Thornwell Home and School for Children - to provide a home

and family and schooling for children and youth who would otherwise be homeless.

December – Meals on Wheels (see front of sheet)

COMMUNITY MISSIONS

Covenant's Emergency Food Pantry- Each Tuesday, 1 - 4 serving over 100 food insecure neighbors per week, with food that many times helps to bridge the gap between food stamps and/or other assistance and the new job.

Athens Nurses Clinic—The Athens Nurses Clinic is a non-profit 501(c)(3) health care clinic providing free evaluation, treatment, and education for acute and chronic medical and dental conditions to uninsured low-and-no income residents of Athens-Clarke County and the surrounding communities.

Homeless Shelter - ecumenical ministry to provide lodging and food.

The Ark - an ecumenical referral agency which advises and helps those in need.

The Athens Area Emergency Food Bank - ecumenical agency to feed the hungry. (see the Feed My Sheep table)

Jubilee Partners - a community of Christians who provide food, lodging and help for refugees and immigrants.

Habitat for Humanity - ecumenical efforts to build homes for those in need.

Our Daily Bread Community Kitchen - serves meals Monday through Friday for anyone in need. Annually, our program provides more than 75,000 nutritious meals with gracious hospitality to men, women and children in need and offers a gateway to other transformational services. Partnering with more than 70 volunteer groups, our daily bread has served guests in Athens, Georgia since 1989. We are grateful to the many, many guests, volunteers, and donors who have sustained this ministry over the decades!

Project Safe - a shelter or home to provide a refuge of safety, lodging, and community for women who have been abused physically or psychologically.

Family Promise - Athens Area Churches unite to assist homeless families who become guests of the hosting congregation for one week at a time. Donations are used for supplies for overnight lodging and meals. Covenant currently provides services for IHN four times a year.
