Come one come all to meet on **Sunday April 3 at 2pm** to discuss CE and what that could be as we progress past COVID.



COVENANT'S COVID POLICIES (EFFECTIVE MARCH 7, 2022)

We look forward to worshiping with you. We continue to strive to protect our loved ones and believe in transparency. Our current COVID policies are based on the CDC's community level rating for Athens Clarke County.

Guidelines for gathering inside Covenant Presbyterian Church:

Green Rating – Mask wearing is optional. Indoor and outdoor food and drinks are permitted. Anyone showing signs and symptoms of COVID is invited to worship with us virtually. Please be considerate of personal preferences to remain contact-free and social distance.

Any changes to ACC's rating will be announced in the *Covenanter*, online, and in worship. You can check <u>ACC's current CDC rating</u> here.

March 2022 Session Meeting Highlights

Pam Knox, church treasurer, presented the proposed budget for next year. Stewardship pledge drive letters, including updated "Personal Information Forms" (PIFs), will be mailed in about a week.

Led by Dana, the Session continued its study of the book, *Presbyterian Polity for Church Leaders*. Kay Brooks was chosen to serve as the Session's representative on the elder nominating committee. Kay and Dana will work together to select a second member and to recommend a third nominee to be elected by the congregation at a congregational meeting on April 24, 2022.

Karen Wetherington and others are working on updating the church directory. The Session will be reaching out to members who we haven't heard from in a while.

The Session approved a motion from B&G for the purchase of a camera security system consisting of 4 cameras for the entrances and main hallway for the cost of around \$1500.

New permanent signs with Covenant's policy for the homeless have been ordered and will be put up soon. The signs include information on phone numbers to call for assistance and will clarify that guests are welcome for overnight stays only and will not be allowed to store their belongings on the church campus.

Worship MT is planning a breakfast of coffee, juice, sweet rolls and fruit following the Easter morning worship service. The Fellowship MT Team is planning activities for the spring and summer including monthly game nights, an Easter egg hunt for children on Saturday April 16th, possibly bringing back the Strawberry Festival in May, and a cake after Pentecost service on June 5th.

The Christian Education MT has scheduled a meeting for Sunday, April 3rd at 2 p.m. to discuss CE as we move out of Covid. All interested persons are invited to attend. There will be child care for the meeting. Submitted by Luanne Rigsby, Clerk of Session
