IMPORTANT MESSAGE ABOUT COVENANT'S 2022-2023 PROPOSED BUDGET!

Dear Covenant friends,

I am writing to give you a brief narrative description of next year's proposed budget, which you received in the mail along with your pledge cards. That way you will can get an overview of changes we are suggesting without having to wade through all the numbers.

First, a note about the budget process. To create the preliminary budget, the Finance Ministry Team (FMT) requests budget amounts from each Ministry Team. They provide amounts based on past spending as well as expected future needs. This has been difficult for the past two years during COVID, but the teams were told to plan for a church that is fully open with all programs operating in person. This preliminary budget is considered to be a "wish budget", with the understanding that amounts may be altered once all pledges are in. At that point, the FMT determines if cuts to the budget should be made and how best to make them, in conjunction with the individual teams where necessary. A final proposed budget is presented to Session, and they vote whether or not to approve it after making any additional changes they desire. The congregation does not vote on the budget but receives it for information. A copy of the current budget is available on the church website.

This year's proposed budget is based on the requests from all ministry teams. There is one error in the printed budget you received—the total budget for 2021-2022 should be \$449,547 as listed on the top. The bottom value double- counts Travis' salary and FICA, a mistake I made in preparing the spreadsheet. Highlights from the proposed budget include:

- A 6% increase in salaries for all employees but Dana based on the recommendations from Personnel to cover the cost of living increases due to inflation. Dana's salary is from his interim contract and he said no increase was necessary. Note that Karen got the same percentage increase but it is divided between salary and an IRA contribution at her request.
- A one-time line item in Administration for \$700 (based on Dana's recommendation) for a congregational study required before a new pastor search can commence.
- An additional line item for funding for training for Session as they work to prepare for a new pastor.
- A reorganization of line items in Christian Ed to reflect function (meals, etc.) rather than programming (Cov. Connection) and to add an intern to help with children's programming such as Cov. Connection and a small stipend for the new library.
- Significant increases in Community Outreach (now renamed Missions—Local/Global) to reflect our continuing needs from the community. The Family Promise model has changed from mostly volunteers to paid staff on weekends, which is more expensive. They also requested an increase in money for the food pantry due to continuing needs in this area.
- No mission trip is planned this year due to continuing concern about travel restrictions. The Montreat trip this June is covered under our special restricted accounts for 2021– 2022. The \$1000 in the 2022–2023 budget for Montreat is a placeholder as discussions about youth ministry/ participation continue.
- Care and Nurture of Young Children has been moved to the Worship section.
