

To the Members and Friends of Covenant,

To begin, the Finance Committee extends its deep gratitude and thanksgiving for the generosity of our church family. Each offering given has made it possible for us to fulfill our mission in our community and the world. We thank you in sincerity for your gifts and offerings.

With that being said, it is critical to provide you with an update of our church's financial status. When we began this year's financial stewardship campaign for Covenant Presbyterian Church, our original goal was \$471,605. To date, we have received \$379,460 in pledges, which is 80% percent of the total goal.

In an effort to reconcile the difference between the original goal and total pledges, the budget was revised to \$425,892. Given the remaining difference, church leaders are exploring further ways to address the difference between the pledges received and the budget.

One way that we are working to revise the budget to address the remaining difference, is through the Covenant/Central Endowment. This endowment was created from the former Central Presbyterian Church congregation after joining with Covenant. Since Central is now part of Covenant, the fund, established with the Presbyterian Foundation, is perpetual in nature and named the Central Covenant Endowment Fund. It is administered by a seven-member committee with four Central members and three Covenant. The policy is to draw from the fund each year an amount equal to 4% of the average monthly value of the fund. This will allow for the fund to produce sufficient income while also being able to increase in value over time. The current policy is that 2/3 of the amount drawn will be given in the form of grants to the community and 1/3 retained by the church to be spent for special projects selected by the session. This year, this equals out to \$12,022.

The budget process is in a holding pattern while the Finance Committee waits for the results of the Personnel study of future staff needs, which should be completed in July. Finance has asked Session to operate under a continuing resolution keeping the 2021-2022 budget going into 2022-2023 until we can use the Session recommendations based on the Personnel report to put together a final budget for 2022-2023.

At this time, we are asking, with ultimate humility, if you are able, to think about pledging more to Covenant so that we can continue to serve our church family, our community of Athens-Clarke, and beyond. In Christ's Love,
