## We Welcome Our Friend from the Czech Republic

On Sunday, August 7 we will welcome a visitor from our sister church in Olomouc, Czech Republic. Jan "Honza" Dostal is a doctoral student in International Relations and will give an update on his church including their efforts to help refugees from Ukraine. Following the church service, there will be an outdoor reception with cookies using recipes from both countries. Please plan to join us! During the rest of his week in Athens, Jan will learn more about our church ministries such as the food pantry and tour some of our allied community organizations including Family Promise and Jubilee Partners.



Family Promise hosting week for Covenant starts with the Evening Host on **Sunday, August 7 through the morning of Sunday, August 14**. It can be especially tricky to cover the slots during summer

while many are traveling, so please consider giving your time for this important work.

Covenant will host homeless families in the Family Promise program, but not in our facility. Milledge Avenue Baptist Church (1690 South Milledge Avenue) will continue to serve as the temporary home for our guests. At MABC, Covenant will provide hosts in 3-hour evening shifts (1 or 2 individuals per shift) and overnight hosts (1-2 individuals per shift). We also need volunteers to prepare evening meals for the families (and evening hosts). Volunteers will be advised on up-to-date Covid-19 measures closer to their time of service.

#### **DEAR OVERNIGHT GUESTS & FRIENDS**

#### Please keep this place free from alcohol, drugs, and weapons.

- No smoking in or near the building
- No panhandling workers or guests
- No peeing or pooping on this place
- No violence, fighting, nudity, sex, or coarse language
  - No littering-use the trash cans
  - Use COVID-19 masks and spacing

By 8:30am each morning after spending a night, overnight sleepers must depart, taking all their personal belongings.

Ephesians 2: 19-22 So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets with Christ Jesus himself as cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord, in whom you are also built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God.

We can offer short relief for your need of shelter to rest. May God's grace lead the steps you take in finding home.

#### ABOUT OUR HOMELESS GUESTS-

Recognizing that homelessness is a current societal crisis, the session in 2020 adopted a policy of limited tolerance of overnight stays of homeless individuals, with certain expectations for the behavior of the guests. Over time, the signage stating those expectations has been lost and will soon be replaced after some modifications.

But we probably gain most from our personal relations with our guests in which I simply stress-

- Pick up after yourself (and others if necessary).
- You can not move in like this is your apartment.
- Carts go behind the sheds.
- We would like to use the church during the day.

We know nearly all our guests personally at some level and they are generally cooperative with our wishes. Several belligerent individuals have been banned from the property for consistent non-compliance.

I do not find our guests threatening, but I also understand that I have the benefit of six-foot-two white male privilege. If you feel threatened or uncomfortable in their presence, please contact me or church staff.

On Sundays, I try to arrive early to assure that everyone is awake and have removed possessions from our common spaces, but I often fail in this. Ushers and greeters can wake them and remind them of our expectations if they feel comfortable in this. The guests are always appreciative of being treated respectfully and kindly.

Finally, I'd like to note that the bulk of our guests have expressed their thankfulness for the limited hospitality that we are able to offer.

**OTHER WAYS YOU CAN HELP!** <u>STAY SAFE</u>—If there is any reason at all that you should NOT physically volunteer-consider the following:

- Make a financial donation to the Fo<mark>od Pan</mark>try by sending a check to Covenant and write "food pantry" in the subject line. (did you know that about \$500 will purchase 2,883 lbs of food from the Food Bank of NEGA which feeds approximately 111 families each week)
- We can use paper grocery bags and some plastic bags to pack the food. If you call the church, someone could even come out to your car and get it.

**PSA FROM YOUR TECHNICAL DIRECTOR!** Recently there has been an uptick in phishing scam emails targeting our congregation. We would like to share some tips in order to better spot these scams as well as advice for how to respond if you think you have received one.

- 1. A major indicator that an email is fraudulent is when the sender's name is in all caps., such as "JOHN DOE". This is a tactic to get your attention but it is not how we normally format our titles.
- 2. Another indicator is if the sender says they are not available to take calls, but the email is urgent. If there is a pressing matter at hand, we will make ourselves available by phone or in person.
- 3. Check the sender's email address. <u>All of our official contact will come from an @covpresathens</u> address. If you see that the email is from a nondescript address, for example "revmail33@gmail.com", this is not from a church staff member.
- 4. If the sender is asking for money or contact information, you should be wary. We will never ask for money outside of the normal giving process.

If you suspect you are being contacted by a phisher, there are a few things you can do.

- 1. Forward the email to Asher adhill@covpresathens.org to verify its legitimacy.
- 2. Contact the church member or staff in question directly via phone or in person to see if they have sent you an email.
- 3. If you are certain that an email address is fraudulent, you can report it to google (assuming it is a gmail account) here https://support.google.com/mail/contact/abuse?hl=en. If the account is not a gmail account, you may need to check with their host about reporting procedures. If you have any further questions or concerns on the subject, feel free to email Asher at adhill@covpresathens.org.
