HIGHLIGHTS OF STATED SESSION MEETING ON AUGUST 23, 2022

Don Bower presented a devotional on "A Matter of Faith: A Presby Podcast," where the hosts interviewed Rev. Dr. David Anderson Hooker of Atlanta on his thoughts about how congregations can face conflict and disagreements and work to resolve them with new insights. He opened the meeting with a prayer for wisdom and vision.

The Session received a letter of resignation from the Session from Kathy Boardman with best wishes and gratitude for her work on the Session.

The proposed budget from Finance Ministry Team for the 2022-2023 fiscal year was approved. The total proposed budget is \$402,437. Finance Ministry Team requested an additional \$23,600 from Session to be taken from unspent funds (\$58,997.49) from the 2021-2022 fiscal year. This would bring the total 2022-2023 budget expenditures, including the Session additions, to \$426,037. Treasurer Pam Knox will place her "Plain Language Summary" of the budget in "The Covenanter". The entire budget spreadsheet will be available in the church office.

Rev. Dana Waters shared with the Session that Covenant's policy of allowing homeless persons to camp out on our premises, as long as they and their belongings are removed by morning, has become a divisive issue for the congregation. There will be a special called Session meeting to discuss the issue on Sunday, September 11, 2022, at 2:00 p.m.

Session approved the job description from the Personnel Committee for the position of Coordinator of Neighborhood Ministries and Christian Education.

Clayton Adams, Chris Wilson, Jennifer Frey and Linda Koehler served as Covenant's commissioners to the Northeast Georgia Presbytery Meeting at the First Presbyterian Church, Athens, GA, on August 20, 2022. Jennifer provided highlights of the meeting.

Session approved a motion that Covenant's Covid-19 food and drink restrictions be lifted to allow food and drink to be served inside with masking optional. Attendees to events are encouraged to follow their own comfort levels with masking. Accommodations such as distanced seating and outdoor options will be available.

Discussion of Montreat's "Thriving Congregations" program will be held at a later meeting.

Fellowship Ministry Team reported several upcoming fellowship opportunities including Game Night on August 26th, hot dog lunch after Rally Day, Fall Picnic in September and coffee fellowship time after church services in the near future.

Dear Covenant friends,

This week the Session passed our 2022-2023 budget. Here is a summary of the changes that have been made to last year's budget. If you would like to see a detailed spreadsheet, you can find it at this link: <u>budget 2022-2023</u>.

The total proposed budget is \$402,437. Of this, \$385,440 is expected to come from pledges, \$3,000 to come from rent and other sources, and \$13,997 from non-pledged income, which may include late pledges, visitor contributions, and new member contributions.

In addition, Session authorized \$23,600 to be taken from unspent funds from the 2021-2022 fiscal year (the net money unspent last year was \$58,997.49) to pay for additional items that were not included in the 2022-2023 budget due to limited pledged income. This will fund the 3-month transition salary and health care for the Technical Director, capital reserve, an intern for Christian Education, the pastor's contingency fund, and an external financial audit. That would make the total budgeted expenditures including the Session additions equal to \$426,037.

The 2022-2023 budget includes the following adjustments from the previous year:

- A 4% cost of living raise for all employees except for Dana, who is already covered by his original contract, as recommended by Personnel.
- A continuation of 10% cuts (last year's was also cut 10 percent from the 2020-2021 budget) for all ministry teams except where they have updated their requests to reflect changes in operation or cost (such as for the CCL music license). This means that most ministry teams will keep the same budget as last year.
- The removal of the items listed in the paragraph above the bulleted list to be funded by Session instead of in the regular budget.
- The conversion of the Technical Director's position from full-time to 10 hours per week with a 3month transition period starting August 1, as previously approved by Session. Expenses for the transition above 10 hours per week will be paid out of Session funds as listed in the paragraph above the bulleted list.
- Adjustment of the Technical Assistant's job to include 3 hours per week, which reflects what is actually used.
- The combination of Judy and Robyn's position into a single job that Judy will take over. To prevent conflicts with one person controlling both income and expenditures, she will always count the offering with another person present.
- A new position previously approved by Session that will combine Christian Education and the Neighborhood Coordinator position to be paid \$26,000 per year plus FICA for part-time work. A position description was approved by Session on August 24, 2022.

For the month of July 1,325 food insecure persons were served.

That includes 451 Children, 216 senior adults, and 658 Adults.
