Library Corner: *The Bronze Bow*

The prestigious Newbery Medal is awarded each year for distinguished contributions to American literature for children. In 1962, Elizabeth George Speare won for *The Bronze Bow*. When I received a copy during my middle school years, I was disdainful about reading a “kiddy book.” A boring cover didn’t help. Once I read it, however, I loved it and still reread it every few years now that I am an adult. The protagonist is a young Galilean Jew chafing under Roman occupation and waiting for a messiah he can follow into battle. OTHER WAYS YOU CAN HELP! STAY SAFE—If there is any reason at all that you should NOT physically volunteer-consider the following:

- Make a financial donation to the Food Pantry by sending a check to Covenant and write “food pantry” in the subject line. (did you know that about \$500 will purchase 2,883 lbs of food from the Food Bank of NEGA which feeds approximately 111 families each week)
- We can use paper grocery bags and some plastic bags to pack the food. If you call the church, someone could even come out to your car and get it.



For the month of September Food Pantry Volunteers and UGA Students (pictured to the left with Bert) served 1,447 food insecure neighbors. Of that 467 were children, 316 were over 65.
