





Highlights of the October 25, 2022, Stated Session Meeting

Linda Koehler presented a devotional on limitations and how, as Christians, we should embrace our limits in order to live with God and depend fully on Him. The meeting was opened with prayer.

Clayton Adams presented the September Financial Report and reported on the financial review of the past fiscal year recently done by retired CPA Lucy Kiel. Lucy stated that "The management of the church's finances continues to be in competent hands." Finance Ministry Team is addressing Lucy's recommendations, including a review and determination of all restricted accounts by Ministry Teams by the end of January.

Session unanimously approved a motion from the Personnel Committee to renew the Interim/ Transitional Pastor, Dana Waters', 12-month contract as of December 1, 2022, with the same terms as the first contract.

Session passed a motion from the Personnel Committee to approve the revised job description for Outreach Coordinator (parttime). Christian Ed Ministry Team, Outreach Ministry Team and the Personnel Committee worked together to rework the job description, which emphasizes the outreach component of the job with the idea of attracting young families to the church.

Covenant's commissioners to the Northeast Georgia Presbytery meeting at Monticello Presbyterian Church on October 25, 2022, gave highlights of the meeting. All churches in the Presbytery are encouraged to support the \$500,000 fund drive of the UGA Presbyterian Student Center for much needed building renovations.

Fellowship Ministry Team is planning the Progressive Christmas Dinner for Friday, December 2, 2022. Hosts for the appetizer, main course and dessert courses are needed! Fellowship is also planning a cookie reception following the Christmas Choral program.

- Make a financial donation to the Fo<mark>od Pan</mark>try by sending a check to Covenant and write "food pantry" in the subject line. (did you know that about \$500 will purchase 2,883 lbs of food from the Food Bank of NEGA which feeds approximately 111 families each week)
- We can use paper grocery bags and some plastic bags to pack the food. If you call the church, someone could even come out to your car and get it.

For the month of October Food Pantry Volunteers and some of the UGA Students (pictured to the left with Bert) served 1,668 food insecure neighbors. Of that 318 were children, 275 were over 65. Thank you Covenant and *May We All Have Enough!*
