Evicted: Poverty and Profit in the American City—Sociology professor Matthew Desmond won the Pulitzer Prize for this book that explores

homelessness within the inner-city neighborhoods of Milwaukee. For a time, he in lived in a dilapidated trailer park, getting to know the residents there and throughout the city. He takes the reader on interesting and sometimes heartbreaking ventures such as riding with an eviction crew, accompanying a slum lord on maintenance and rent-collection rounds, and going with people to eviction court. Although the writing style is easy and compelling, sometimes the subject matter is difficult. Still, this is a book that helped me understand a great deal and that I'm very glad I read.
