Highlights of the January 28, 2023, Stated Session Meeting

A stated Session meeting was held on Saturday, January 28, 2023, at end of the Session's retreat at Rock Eagle 4-H Center. Lianne Rigsby presented a devotional based on John 13:34-35 and shared practical tips for elders which she had learned from Rev. Jim Bowden many years ago. Luanne shared "Small Steps of Love" by Henri Nouwen and opened the meeting with prayer.

Luanne Rigsby presented the Clerk's report which was accepted into the minutes. The report included:

A letter of transfer request for Kathy Boardman to Madison Presbyterian Church

Removal of Bob Smith, who recently passed away, from membership rolls

Request for approval of baptism of Charles Naveen Arora

Approval of Covenant's 2022 church statistical report, which includes an updated membership total of 230

Letter from Jim Newland awarding a grant from The Central Covenant Endowment Fund of \$10,286.77 to be used at Session's discretion

Thank you letter from Family Promise

The Session approved a motion that the grant from the Central Covenant Endowment Fund (\$10,286.77) be set aside for the Pastor Nominating Committee to be used for travel expenses for pastoral candidates.

The Financial Summary for December, 2022, indicated that everything looks to be on track financially. Ministry team chairs were reminded to let Finance Ministry Team know whether to keep the restricted accounts under their teams or terminate them. MT chairs were also reminded that Pam Knox, Treasurer, would like the total dollar amount requested for their proposed budgets for next fiscal year by February.

Session approved Susan Parish, Randy Parish, Donny Whitehead and Dick Zimdars as be Covenant's commissioners to the February 25th Northeast Georgia Presbytery meeting at Belle Terrace Presbyterian Church in Augusta, GA. With the exception of Dick Zimdars, the same commissioners will be asked to serve as commissioners for the March 25th called Presbytery meeting on ZOOM. Kathryn Fowler will to serve as alternate for the Feb 25th meeting. Covenant will be hosting the May 23rd meeting of the NEGA Presbytery Meeting.

Session elected Pam Knox to serve as Church Treasurer and Luanne Rigsby as stated Clerk of the Session for 2023.

Session approved a motion that Covenant partner with Athens Free Clinic which provides services for those who don't have health care. They will be using our space one Monday a month in February, March and April on a trial basis. Volunteers from Covenant will be needed for patient check-in.

Session approved serving of communion on the first Sunday of every month and also on Maundy Thursday and Christmas Eve in 2023.

Valerie Stone reported on the association with our partner congregation of the ECCB in Olomouc, Czech Republic. Valerie has been sending a monthly newsletter to them to keep in contact. Covenant raised about \$5000.00 to send to the Olomouc congregation to aid in helping refugees from Ukraine. The church in Olomouc is hosting a conference for partner congregations the first week of in July. Hopefully Covenant will be sending a representative.

Bert Ballard-Myer reported on activities of the Mission Outreach Ministry Team, which include the Food Pantry, partnership with Athens Free Clinic, and the Campus Kitchen/ UGarden using our kitchen to feed more than 600 people per week. There will be a volunteer appreciation event in April.

The Fellowship Ministry Team reported that the Christmas Progressive Dinner and a punch and cookie reception after the Christmas choral worship service were well received and attended. Future activities include monthly game nights every third Friday evening and the annual Heart of Covenant Dinner, planned for February 11, 2023. *Submitted by Luanne Rigsby, Clerk of Session*

Athens Free Clinic at Covenant

The Athens Free Clinic is coming to Covenant on the following dates:

Feb. 13, March 20 and April 3 (2-4 p.m.) This is a totally free health clinic staffed by a Doctor and Medical Students from UGA. We are so excited that Covenant can now provide space for a needed health care resource for families in need right here on the East Side of Athens. This free clinic will be able to provide for urgent care needs, basic screenings, referrals to specialists, lab orders, prescriptions, and gender-affirming care (a vital extension of our hope to reach out to our LGBTQIA+ neighbors). Our greatest need right now is for 2 volunteers for each of the above dates to be at our check-in table to hand out forms to clients coming in for their appointments.
