Covenant Church Work Day Coming Soon! Saturday, March 26, 8:30am—2pm. Coffee, donuts and lunch sandwiches will be offered.



- 1. Plant flowering plants—ONLY azaleas, ONLY camellias, and ONLY hydrangeas.
- 2. We will spread mulch
- 3. Annuals needed for the urns and potted plants that sit in the courtyard.
- 4. The church sign area and the front corner need color—plants that are low maintenance and can stand the summer sun. I choose red/orange begonias because they bloom all summer and keep their color. Other suggestions? Let Carolyn know.

Jeffry Lynch who has worked part-time for us, will be with us on March 26 to help with the plantings. Jeffery will prepare the holes or most of them on Friday, March 25. There are a couple of post hole diggers so if you would like come help Jeffery. A truck load of mulch will be delivered Friday, March 25.

There will be a power washer (or 2) and a leaf blower (or 2) that someone can use.

Pray for sunshine and warmth. Bring a lawn chair, your work gloves, and a small trowel for digging the small stuff.
