Would folks like to see the return of BRAS (Building Relationships and Support)? This group for women consisted of one or two evening get-to-know-you gatherings a year hosted by a church member in their home.
The second event is the Covenant Coffee House. Modeled on the Coffee House events at our sister church in Olomouc, Czech Republic, this evening gathering during the summer gave all ages a chance to share their talents and shine with such offerings as playing music, singing, recitations, magic routines, skits, original poetry readings, etc.

PROCESS FOR THE ELECTION OF ELDERS BEGINS! Each year Covenant elects its officers to serve a 3 year term on the Session. The involvement of the congregation is important during the entire process. Donny Whitehead is the Nominating Committee Chair with Julie Bower as the second Elder approved by the Session. Now the congregation recommends members of the church to serve on the Nominating Committee. The 2 elders will then select one member to nominate to the congregation to be elected to serve with them on the Nominating Committee. Highlights of the May 23, 2023 Stated Session Meeting

For the devotional, Donny Whitehead read Philippians 3:13-14 and asked, "What is the difference between a job and a calling?" As leaders of the church, we are here not just to do a job but because we are called to work together to proclaim the love and saving power of God in this particular time and place. Donny opened the meeting with prayer.

Pam Knox, church treasurer, reported that we have received more pledges and non-pledged income than expected, and spending has been less than anticipated because of unfilled positions. Finance Ministry Team is planning to invest some of the extra money in a CD to earn higher interest. Pam presented the 2023-2024 proposed budget of \$450,507. One change from the original budget is a recommendation from Finance MT to place \$12,000 from the 2022-2023 surplus into Capital Reserve. The budget includes 6% salary increases for all personnel as requested by the Personnel Committee, and all ministry teams received the budgets they requested. The Session approved the 2023-2024 budget as presented.

Session elected Donny Whitehead and Julie Bower to serve on the Elder Nominating Committee for the 2026 class of elders. Donny and Julie will gather nominees for the 3rd member of the committee from the congregation, and that member will be elected at a congregational meeting.

At the November 1, 2022, called meeting, the Session approved changes in Covenant's Overnight Guest Policy with the plan of assessing the changes in three months. The trial period was extended until May to allow for completion of all changes to be implemented and for assessment of how they were working. Though the changes have improved the situation, we still have homeless sleeping around the building at night who have to be vacated in the morning. Several elders expressed concern for the safety of people camping on our grounds as well as for church members who come to the building alone. Another concern is the church's liability should something bad happen to someone or to our building as long as we are sanctioning the presence of unsupervised people camping on our grounds. Session approved a motion that Covenant no longer allow individuals to sleep on our campus without prior Session approval and that electricity to all outside electrical outlets be turned off 24h/day. The port-apotty, sink and little food pantry will be maintained as is for the time being. Building and Grounds will replace the current signage with the updated policy. Athens-Clarke Police Department will be notified of our new policy. Bert Ballard-Myer, Kathryn Fowler, Valerie Stone and Donny Whitehead volunteered to serve as a "brainstorming group" to explore other ways, such as redirecting our resources and efforts toward existing local charities and government advocacy, to help the homeless in our community. By consensus, Session agreed to deny the request from Joy Village School to rent space on our property. By renting to another organization, which the church does not own or manage, Covenant could lose its property tax-exempt status in Athens-Clarke County.

Bert Ballard-Myer and Kathryn Fowler reported on the May 23rd NEGA Presbytery meeting held at Covenant. The Session applauded Building and Grounds MT for their exceptional job in getting the facility looking its best for the meeting. Dana thanked everyone who helped make the meeting a success. Amy Baer was welcomed into the NEGA Presbytery as was Steven Barnes, pastor of Oconee Presbyterian Church. Will Norman, pastor at UGA Presbyterian Student Center encouraged us to help connect high school graduates with campus ministries.

Our pianist, Connor Austell, is moving to South Carolina. His last day will be at the end of June.

Covenant will be providing a meal for about 30 students at the Presbyterian Student Center the first Tuesday of every month starting Fall Semester.

A group from Covenant will be marching in the Pride Parade on June 3rd at 2:00 p.m. We will have a resource table at the parade from 3-6.

We will begin our summer schedule of worship at 10:00 a.m. beginning June 4th.

Dana will be taking study leave the week of June 5th. Rev. Ron Gilreath will be filling in for him on Sunday, June 11th.
