WELCOME Aaron Carter-Enyi and Family! We have only been in Athens a few weeks, but we already feel at home. Betsy and Rich and many others have spent hours, even days, preparing the music ministry offices for new carpet and me to move into the office. The Zimdars invited us to go swimming this week. We have been truly blessed by Covenant's warm welcome of our family.

First, a little bit about our family: Quintina and I were married in 2013 and moved to Georgia in 2016. Arinze is six years old. His name is pronounced ah-RIN-zay. Uchendu will be four on July 2, which is also my first Sunday at the piano. Uchendu goes by Uche for short (oo-chay). Chizaram is one year old and is called Zara for short. Arinze and Uche were both born at Grady Hospital in Atlanta. Zara was born in Nigeria but received lifesaving surgery at Egleston Hospital on the Emory campus. Her full name, Chizaram, means "God heard me."

Quintina will be starting her PhD program in musicology in the Hugh Hodgson School of Music in August. She completed her Master's at UGA in May (see picture). Her mother is a choir mistress in Nigeria and taught her and her five siblings to sing in harmony together. She has been a choir singer most of her life and was a director of several church choirs and a university choir before moving to the United States.

I completed my PhD in music theory at Ohio State University in 2016 and joined Morehouse College's faculty the same year. You can find a lot about my scholarship online, including videos and articles, but less about my church service. I have nearly 18 years of experience leading congregational singing from the organ and piano. Qualifications specifically geared toward sacred music include a Master of Music in Choral Conducting with Organ as my primary instrument and a Colleague Certification in organ performance, all completed in 2011. I have ministered in a variety of denominations including Episcopal, United Church of Christ, Methodist and Lutheran (ELCA). I served as the Music Director at North Springs UMC in Atlanta from 2016 to 2019 when my family and I moved to Nigeria for me to undertake a Fulbright fellowship. We remained in Nigeria throughout the COVID pandemic, returning to the US in 2022.

Thank you so much for the opportunity to serve your community as your new music director and pianist, and I look forward to ministering for the first time this Sunday. I realize many of you will be travelling this weekend, so as they say in Nigeria (my wife's country of birth), we wish you journey mercies!





What is the Olomouc partnership all about?

(It's pronounced "Ol-oh-moats.")





The idea of congregational partnerships was promoted by Rev. Ken Meeks in the Northeast Georgia Presbytery's online newsletter in 2008. When we think of ourselves as "bestowers," reaching out to churches in other parts of the world only to offer aid, we miss opportunities for sharing and learning. Covenant elders attended a Church Partnership Network (CPN) conference in Annapolis where from American representatives learned about the Evangelical Church of the Czech Brethren (ECCB). Covenant was matched with Evangelický Kostel church in Olomouc (population 100,378) in the eastern province of Moravia. The two progressive churches are of similar mind and mission, and both are in small cities that are homes to universities.

Soon after the conference, visits between the two churches began. Thirty-four Covenant folks have visited Olomouc while eleven of their church members have visited Athens. Some visits were purely social while others were for CPN conferences or English Camp. So far, Covenant has developed four English Camps for fellowship and sharing culture while simultaneously offering those in Olomouc a chance to practice their English. During each week-long Camp, there are small group discussions for all ages, outings, music, presentations, and the Coffee House talent show. Camps were every two years (2013, 2015, 2017, and 2019), but Covid-19 sidelined the 2021 English Camp as well as an Olomouc group that planned to visit Athens in 2020. The partnership is now in a rebuilding phase.

After hosting online conferences for several years, the Church Partnership Network is offering an in-person conference called "Together On the Way" from July 9-14—and the site is our partner church! The conference's American planning committee includes Covenant Elder Valerie Stone (English Camp 2019). The Olomouc planning committee reported that no American youth signed up and asked Valerie's 14-year-old son, Eli, to attend and help since he was a team member in English Camp 2019. Covenant's presence is rounded out by Joan Prittie (English Camps 2015 and 2019). Covenant's three attendees are creating a half-hour devotional program celebrating fellowship through food. Main sessions include Together in the Family, Together in the Church, Together in Society, and Together in the World. Topics will include the challenges of declining church memberships, ministry to Ukraine refugees (including some attendees), climate change / environmental issues, and overcoming racism / xenophobia.

We look forward to a week of fellowship and learning while also rebuilding our partnership. Covenant's attendees plan to bring home fresh ideas and build support for ongoing connections!
