Pastor Nominating Committee Update 7/23/23

The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has met a number of times since it was formed this spring. The initial meeting for Presbytery training, which is required for all PNCs, was conducted by Rev. Hilary Shuford, General Presbyter of the Northeast Georgia Presbytery. She was assisted by Rev. Tom Buchanan, chair of the NEGA Presbytery's Committee on Ministry and Covenant's liaison to that committee. After that training, Karen Foutz and Linda Rogers were elected co-chairs of the PNC and procedural ground rules were established. The PNC then began work on the Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP), the document that describes Covenant and its needs and will be viewed by potential pastor candidates. The group has also met with Jim Newland, chair of the previous PNC, who discussed his experiences on PNCs at Covenant and Central Presbyterian. The frequency of PNC meetings will increase once everyone is back on a regular schedule in the fall.

The PNC will be working on the Ministry Discernment Profile over the coming months, which will need to be approved by both the Session and the NEGA Presbytery before it can be posted on the Church Leadership Connection (CLC) site and viewed by potential candidates. Crafting the MDP will take time and we appreciate the congregation's patience and prayers during this crucial step. Also, please be aware that due to the sensitive nature of the information and its potential effect on candidates, considerations of the Pastor Nominating Committee are confidential and PNC members can only discuss details of the meetings within the committee. We will keep you informed via regular updates in *The Covenanter*.



It's been two months since hedge shrubbery around the campus buildings has been pruned. This growth is mostly nandina, spirea, holly, and gardenia.


Thanks to Catherine Tyson's generosity we have a battery powered pruning shears and blower to lighten the workload. This job takes about an hour.
