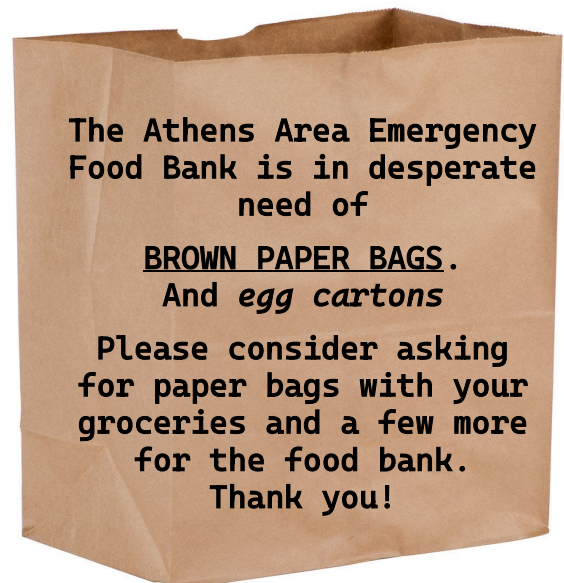

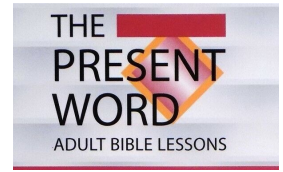


CHRISTIAN EDUCATION CLASSES FOR ALL AGES!

2023 Holiday Benevolence Market

What is the Holiday Benevolence Market?

This is the 29th year of this symbolic gift-giving opportunity and First Presbyterian Church and Covenant Presbyterian Church are partnering to host the market on the East Side of Athens. Our hope is to flood the Market with families from all the Athens congregations to join us in supporting our local non-profits! There will be more than 30 local Athens non-profit organizations sharing about their service to our

community...to give them a chance to share about how they serve our neighbors most in need, to connect with new possible volunteers and to collect donations for their work.

Why should we go to the Holiday Benevolence Market?

We hope your members will attend worship at your congregation and then hop on over to Covenant to shop for symbolic holiday gifts with your children and grandchildren. This Market is specifically designed to spread the word about the organizations in our amazing city while also teaching our children and grandchildren about generosity and how we are blessed to be a blessing.

How does the Holiday Benevolence Market work?

When you arrive you will be greeted and handed two "Shopping Lists"....a grown-up one and a children's one. As you look around the Fellowship Hall you will see the 30 local organizations listed in the shopping lists set up at tables (ie. Athens Habitat for Humanity, Project Safe, Athens Area Diaper Bank, Athens Wellness Clinic, Books for Keeps, etc.).

The **Grown-Up Shopping List** will include items like: **Athens Area Diaper Bank:** \$15 to provide diapers for a child for a month and **Athens Area Habitat for Humanity:** \$5.00 box of nails

Our **Children's Shopping List** will include lower-cost and more *concrete* items that might appeal to children who want to buy a gift for their parents or grandparents. For example- **Strong Girls Serve** might list \$1 for pencils or \$5 for books. With the Children's Shopping List we are hoping to help our children begin to understand the simplicity of giving to others and what a huge impact small acts of generosity can make for our neighbors in need.

Once you have "shopped" around the Holiday Benevolence Market you check off your Shopping List with all of the symbolic gifts you'd like to purchase and write a single check to the "Holiday Benevolence Market" (100% tax deductible).
