This year is coming to a close and the Holy Spirit has nudged me to reach out to you all to tell you what I have witnessed. As I write this message, our devoted Covenant Food Pantry crew plus new friends, who are filling in for our UGA students, are all busy in the Fellowship Hall. Some of them have already been here at the church since 9 a.m. anticipating and preparing for the food to arrive. They are carefully unloading, unpacking, sorting, and curating bags for the hungry families who will come in a few hours. In addition, our new cooking crew (who are seasoned Covenant cooking veterans) are preparing a delicious hot meal for our neighbors experiencing homelessness. Hot ham, beans and cornbread are being lovingly prepared and will soon be delivered into the hands of at least 60 people experiencing homelessness today in Athens.

I am feeling a rush of gratitude this morning because of you all. Today's work and the numerous other programs through which you serve are truly an inspiration. You, Covenant Friends, are a people who actively seek work for your hands and feet to serve your neighbors every day of the year. You are blessed to be a blessing and, truly, you are being exactly that. Your heart shows in your willingness to say 'yes' even to new things you've never done. On behalf of everyone you are serving today and all year long, I want to tell you how much your work matters and how proud you should be of living into your calling to be disciples and servants of your hurting neighbors. We may never see their faces or know their names, but I hope you know that in serving them you are serving none other than our faithful Jesus himself.
