#### Highlights of the February 27, 2024, Stated Session Meeting

A stated Session meeting was held on February 27, 2024. In light of African American History month, Bert Ballard-Myer presented a devotional and comments by Jim Wallis, theologian and founder of *Sojourners* magazine in which he urged us to name racism as a sin which negates the work of Christ and the purpose of the church and then to repent from it as we are instructed in Matthew 3:2. Bert opened the meeting with prayer.

Luanne Rigsby, Clerk, reported that with the addition of Jim and Pam Thompson as members, our new membership total is 215.

The financial summary for January, 2024 indicated that everything looks to be going very well. Ministry teams were reminded to submit their budgets for the upcoming fiscal year by February 29. The stewardship campaign for next fiscal year will be March 15<sup>th</sup> – April 7th. Session approved the newly written Covenant Financial Policy Manual developed by the Finance Ministry Team with substantial input from church staff.

Session also approved the use of \$800.00 from last year's surplus funds to cover leadership development training for staff.

Valerie Stone and Carolyn Hatfield gave highlights of the February 24<sup>th</sup> NEGA Presbytery meeting held at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Augusta. The NEGA Presbytery approved the examinations of five new pastors. Included in this group was Rev. Karen Wilson Fletcher, who did an internship at Covenant in 2018. There was a remembrance for elders and pastors who had passed away during 2023. The commissioners also enjoyed visiting with former members Steve and Lola Bell.

The current gutters on the church building are not sufficient for the amount of water that comes off the roof. This has resulted in flooding and mud in the downstairs classrooms. Session approved using up to \$18,000.00 in surplus funds (out of the remaining \$38,000) to purchase new gutters and drainage system. A drain will be installed in the Memorial Garden to catch and redirect the rainfall that pools up in the garden. Session thanked B & G for their diligence and recent hard work.

Dana announced that he and his family will be taking a vacation in France April 10-17<sup>th</sup>. Rev. Ron Gilreath will fill in for him in the pulpit.

## Pastor Nominating Committee Update #4

## 2/25/24

This update from the PNC is presented in a Q&A format to better address questions the congregation may have about the pastor search process from the time the PNC was formed until now.

## Q. Who are the members of the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC)?

A. Karen Foutz, Kathryn Fowler, Wyatt Herndon, Rose Kisaalita, Bill Rigsby, Linda Rogers, and Brian Stone. Karen and Linda are co-chairs.

## **Q.** What has the Pastor Nominating Committee accomplished since its formation?

A. After the PNC was approved by the Congregation in April, PNC members attended an orientation session in May led by the NEGA General Presbyter to learn about the processes and the work ahead of them. The PNC's first task was to select Co-Chairs and clarify committee procedures. Next, the Ministry Discernment Profile, or MDP, was carefully crafted. This document includes the Head of Staff/Pastor position requirements, a thorough description of Covenant and the Athens community, detailed answers to seven narrative questions, and more. The PNC utilized the Mission Study Task Force Report to aid in completing the MDP. In December, the PNC presented the completed MDP to Session and the Presbytery Committeeon Ministry for review and unanimous approval. In January, the Head of Staff position was posted to the Church Leadership Connection (CLC) site, an internet-based matching and referral system. The PNC is now receiving and evaluating applications.

## Q. How is the position being publicized to potential candidates?

A. The Church Leadership Connection site mentioned above is the best source of candidates. Qualified candidates are "matched" with positions posted on the CLC site. Our Head of Staff position is also listed on Covenant's website on the Home page and on the Documents page under "Employment Opportunities". These listings include the link to the Church Leadership Connection site. In addition, advertisements in publications such as *Presbyterian Outlook* are being developed.

## Q. If I know someone who is interested in the position, can I refer them to the PNC?

A. Yes! Give them our email address: PNC@covpresathens.org.

## Q. How long will it take to find our new pastor?

A. That is difficult to answer because it depends on many things, not all of which are within our control. The best answer is when God calls the right person.

## Q. Will Dana stay until the new pastor is hired?

A. Yes, that is his plan.

## Q. Who should we contact if we have questions about the pastor search?
