Update from Our Sister Church in Olomouc

Several joyful events have taken place in the community of our congregation since the beginning of the year: we have entered the new year ecumenically. Traditionally, in the first weeks of January, ecumenical meetings are held in various churches in Olomouc. It is somewhat sad that the interest in them is getting smaller and smaller, but we wanted to encourage it this year among the young generation, so I cooked a big pot of goulash and after one of the prayer meetings in the Catholic Church of St. Wenceslas (the biggest church in Olomouc), the youth gathered in our premises. The motto was: "invite your Catholic to our youth group" :-) (or a member of any other church). We consider it important to meet as Christians across the denominational spectrum. Another ecumenical event also took place in January: a service for the victims of the shooting at the Faculty of Arts in Prague. We are a university town, and this horrific act hit many of us hard. Our priest Jan Lukas preached at the service in the Catholic church and over 200 people, mainly students and teachers of Palacký University in Olomouc, attended.

We also had a nice meeting within the congregation: we welcomed a guest - pastor Štěpán Janča, who served us with a sermon and an afternoon lecture about his involvement in missionary activities and helping Christians in South Sudan. Another joyful Sunday afternoon was spent with the children: again, traditionally our Sunday School teachers prepare a carnival for the children before the beginning of Lent. We also experienced great joy during the baptism service, during which Julie Batla (daughter of Dan and Misha) was baptized. And the latest news: Jan Lukas celebrated his 60th birthday in early March, and last week our congregation held the swearing in of the newly elected "senior committee" (sorry, I don't know what the PC USA equivalent is for this; it is simply a higher administrative body than the eldership of the congregation). I was also elected to this committee at our Convention (????), so I would be grateful for your intercessory prayers.

However, we are also still experiencing a challenging time regarding the renovation of our church building. Financial contributions from all ECCB congregations for this year's Easter Sunday will go towards the repair of our church, but we will not receive the proceeds until next year. We didn't know that before, so we were already counting on that money being raised for this year's building improvements, so we are in a rather complicated situation where we will most likely have to borrow money for construction that is already contracted. The work is scheduled for 6 years and it was already really necessary to get started (we have a leaky 100 year old roof for example). But it is financially extremely demanding, and we cannot rely only on donations from members of the Olomouc congregation. So we are learning how to write grant applications and show the local community that there is a vibrant ECCB congregation that has something to offer the city of Olomouc. And that in order to continue to do our ministry, we need help from those who may not even be Christians but are grateful for the cultural diversity of the local community. If you would like to see how the reconstruction is planned, we also have an English version of the website that describes it https://kostelnanaplavce.cz/en/. We wish our partner congregation a blessed Easter season! You are always in our hearts!





- Formal clothing is not necessary even for Sunday morning worship.
- If you are not comfortable standing for hymns or readings during worship, please remain sitting.
- If you have difficultly sitting for long periods, you may stand in the back.
- If you listen better when your hands are occupied, you are welcome to do non-distracting/non-messy handiwork (knitting, cross-stitch, etc.).
- You are welcome to bring a cushion or lap blanket.
- If you have dietary concerns, you're welcome to bring your own food to gatherings.

We hope you find that Covenant is a reassuring place to worship, explore, grow, and enjoy fellowship.
