





"In Bad Faith: Unpacking Christian Nationalism's Distortion of the Gospel" Facilitated by Pastor Tom Buchanan, Covenant Presbyterian Church Tuesday, October 15, from 6:30 to 8:00 PM

The ideology of Christian Nationalism has made headlines in America in recent years with its dangerous blending of Christian and national identities, distorting our democratic institutions and values to be sure, but even more importantly, the church's prophetic witness to Jesus' gospel of justice, peace, and inclusion. Through group discussion of the recent 90-minute documentary "Bad Faith," this Covenant Forum event will unpack Christian Nationalism's dangers, with emphasis on the many ways it deviates from faithful understandings of our biblical and theological heritage. 
