



Green Dream Team News – The Green Dream Team met April 13, 2025 in the church library following the Sunday Worship service. There were eight members present. Gloria Pylant and Barbara Burnett shared information from The Clean and Renewable Energy Act Workshop in which they had participated. Five GDT members had attended the five session workshop held in the library of our church. The purpose of the workshop was to keep the community aware of the resolution passed by the city-county government in 2019. Many of the proposals in the act have been funded by our local SPLOST Act. The electric buses driven by the city transportation system. an integrated data system to monitor energy usage in city -county facilities, solar installations in selected city-county facilities and loans for energy efficiency remolding for lower income homes are all part of proposals in the act. It was exciting to hear of these efforts to combat climate change here in our city and county, The business session included plans for a Minute for Missions in the April 27 church service, an update on buckets placed in the alcove to collect plastic shopping bags for the Food Pantry and plans to add additional buckets for recyclable materials to be taken to Charm as well as plans for a field trip to Charm. Highlights of the April 22, 2025, Stated Session Meeting

Kathryn Fowler opened the meeting with a devotional based on Romans 12 and the communion of saints. We are one body with many different parts, and each member belongs to God and to each other. We are to be devoted to each other and honor one another.

Luanne Rigsby reported that with the passing of Larry Hatfield, our new membership total is 217. Family Promise expressed its thanks for our donation of \$650.00.

As of the end of March, pledges received and non-pledged income exceeded the anticipated income, and expenditures were less than expected. Giving Sunday is April 27th. After reviewing the pledges, the Finance Ministry Team will prepare a finalized budget for the 2025-26 fiscal year which begins July 1.

Building and Grounds has selected Lewis Company Floors to replace the tile flooring in the fellowship hall, kitchen, and hall in front of the food pantry, pending available funds. The Finance Ministry Team will discuss funding for the flooring at their May 1st meeting.

Session discussed the problem of excessive trash being left on the property by passers through. The first step to address this will be obtaining a security assessment for the church property.

The Athens Clarke Planning Department recommended that the property next door to Covenant be rezoned to Commercial-Neighborhood and the county commission will consider it at their May 6th meeting. Tom Buchanan, Caly DePalma, and Kathryn Fowler will try to meet District 8 County Commissioner, Carol Myers, to discuss the rezoning.

Karl Barnett and Kathryn Fowler will be Covenant's commissioners to the NEGA Stated Presbytery meeting at First Presbyterian Church in Greensboro, GA, on May 20, 2025. There will be two hybrid town hall meetings at Oconee Presbyterian on May 1st at 4:00 and 6:00 p.m. to discuss an antiracism policy the commissioners will be voting on.

Building and Grounds are planning a workday for May 17th. Help is needed!

Brian Herndon will visit all adult church school classes for feedback.

Covenant Youth and adult leaders are attending the Montreat Youth Conference June 1 - 7. We will be joining the youth group from Milledgeville Presbyterian, and all are staying at the Bowden house.

Session approved beginning the summer schedule on June 1st with worship starting at 10:00 a.m. We will revert to the 11:00 a.m. worship time on Rally Day, August 17, 2025.

The Spring Picnic/Strawberry Festival will be May 4th from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. New members will be hosted and introduced by "old" members.

May 11th is the date for the High School and College Graduate Reception honoring Delaney Braswell, George McMaster, Carrie Tweedell and Micah Shannon.

This year's Pride Parade and Pride Fest will be a combined event held on June 7th with the parade at 5:00. Covenant hope to have a float.

Tom is planning a summer sermon series entitled "Summer Saints" June 22nd through July 27th.

Session approved Tom's request for time off May 23-26, 2025. Following discussion, motion passed. Rev. Ron Gilreath will be guest preacher.
