Organic mulches are especially beneficial because they are environmentally friendly, inexpensive—or even free—and easy to apply. Common organic mulches in our area include pine straw, wood chips, shredded hardwood mulch, compost, leaves, and grass clippings. By mulching your garden, you can create healthier soil, support stronger plants, and practice more sustainable gardening.
